

Hispanics in the US: The Statistics

- 55 million Hispanics in the US
 - o 17% of country's total population
- 119 Million
 - o Estimated population of Hispanics in the US in 2060
- 64% Mexican, 9.5% Puerto Rican, 3.7% Cuban, 3.7% Salvadoran, 3.3% Dominican, and 2.4% Guatemalan.
- 73.3% of the Hispanic population above the age of 5 spoke Spanish at home in 2013.
- 35.2% of Hispanics were born outside of the US in 2013.

Hispanics in Greenville: The Statistics

- 29, 263 Latinos in Greenville County
 - 6.8% of the population of the county
- 48% Mexican, 20% South American (Colombian most common), 12%
 Central American (Guatemalan most common), 12% Puerto Rican, and 8% other Latino descent.
- 57% of Greenville Latinos are male.
- 41.7% US natives, 58.3% born outside of US
